TALKING BOOKS & BRAILLE LIBRARY



Braille Library

- 5,467 patrons from birth to 101 years old
- 207,681 audiobooks, magazines, large print books, and players distributed last year
- 36 children in Crib to Crayons
- All of TBBL's patrons switched to Duplication on Demand
- 5,000 NLS patrons have access to the Alexa Skill "My Talking Books"
- Coming soon from NLS: DA2 digital audio players

- Annual Report (statistics) due at the end of March


REFERENCE


CATALOGING & ACQUISITIONS
